Put the website link in an email when you send a email to the community. Send an email every 2 weeks with something about the community.

No suggestions – website better than most neighborhoods.

Open forum of communicating.

Tabs need to be re assigned. Welcome should have community map and directory and any necessary forms for downloading.

Board Comment: There is a community map and directory on the website. ARC forms can be found in the ARC Tab section.

I would like a monthly bulletin board for notices and sales items..maybe even for venting.

Board Comment: See the tab Community Bulletin Board on the website. The Board believes that venting concerns get the most prompt response if directed to a Board member or our Property Management Representative as opposed to posting in a public forum.

The website should have an editor who can devote more time to its structure and current input or eliminate the website and have a quarterly newsletter.

Board Comment: The Board President who serves as webmaster welcomes the opportunity to train any willing resident on the process of updating the website under the Board's guidance and in compliance with the hosting company's processes and requirements.

#### **QUESTION #7..Involvement by volunteer committees**

I answered question 7 as no first then changed it to yes. There should be committees that the Board should listen to and acts with. There has been disconnect with this in the previous years.

#### **General Comments Related to Question # 10**

I am unclear as to the role of Board vs Volunteer Groups. For example, the request for a group to schedule a meeting to reactivate Neighborhood Watch seems to be Board work, not the responsibility of a volunteer group.

Board Comment: A neighborhood watch program which increases safety and security of our community is the responsibility of every resident.

I have some interest in serving on the Architectural Review Committee at some point in the future.

Consider the possibility of installing a camera at the entrance to record license plate numbers.

We want a gate installed at the sidewalk near the front of the neighborhood. It is too easy and tempting to access the back of our homes without detection. Could the Board look into getting blocks of discounted prices for security system installations?

Why have some neighbors been allowed to extend beyond four feet into the back common area?

Give owners chance at special meeting to express issues. Much faster communication when we have break ins or solicitors. Ask apartment manager across the street to tell their residents not to walk in our neighborhood. We need a camera at our front entrance.

I think the crime rate for a community as small as ours is high. We should all be more vigilant in watching out for our neighbors. If a Neighborhood Watch would help, I am all for it, but I don't know if that is just the same as watching out for our neighbors.

Board Comment: We believe that a formal, organized NW would be more effective which is why we were soliciting for volunteers. No one responded.

I have an interest in serving on the ARC at some point in time.

I would be willing to take the lead in a garden club.

Resident's Comment related to Question 6 Traffic Signal at entrance to Woodstone Cottages.

We are not in favor of a traffic light. The only time that this is an issue between 7:45 and 8:15 on weekdays. I don't feel that this is enough to warrant a light and may cause "random" traffic to come in and out of our neighborhood. I would be in favor of adding a security gate with a code off of Hawkins Rd. to deter people from coming into the community for safety reasons. Also the traffic light would "shine" into the rooms that face Roper Mountain Rd for those residences and that would not be pleasant at night.

I feel that the speed limit is too high for a neighborhood our size. Some people reach the speed limit, which with the length of our roads does not constitute a speed of 25 mph which is a potential hazard due to the high volume of walkers, runners and children. A limit of 15 mph would increase the safety of the neighborhood. I realize that residential streets in the State are normally 25 mph, but do not feel our community's conditions are suitable for such a limit.
